**Housing for New Hope (HNH)** is a Durham-based nonprofit agency with a focus to develop, secure, and manage affordable housing opportunities. We strengthen our community by being an advocate for those experiencing homelessness and for those at risk of becoming homeless. We are a key part of a community-wide effort to provide housing and services that lead from insecurity to stability and success.



## Assertive Engagement (AE)

The Assertive Engagement Program (AE) provides limited case management services to uninsured homeless individuals residing in Durham County. Qualified individual(s) must be living in places not meant for human habitation such as living on the streets, parks, in an emergency shelter, encampment, or exiting from an institution such as the hospital or jail. It's our goal to remove the barriers of homelessness by identifying community resources and provide support to sustain independence.

## Rapid Rehousing

The Rapid Rehousing program moves homeless families and individuals back into permanent housing as quickly as possible (within 30 days of approval for the rehousing program) through landlord outreach, rental assistance, case management, moving help and assistance with furnishings (when available). Rapid Rehousing works with families and individuals who have barriers to permanent housing (e.g., past evictions, unemployment, domestic violence, criminal history) and connects them to community resources to further aid their housing stability.

## Streets-to-Home

The Streets-to-Home program is a case managed supportive housing program designed to assist chronically homeless individuals with obtaining and remaining in supportive housing. The program which is being funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development allows Housing for New Hope to provide rental assistance to individuals who meet the criteria of chronically homeless.

## Housing for New Hope Properties

HNH owns and operates four affordable housing properties in Durham. Our **Permanent Supportive Housing** properties, Williams Square and Andover Apartments, accommodates 44 individuals experiencing chronic homelessness with disabilities. On-site tenant advocates support the needs of the clients and offer life skill management classes. Our **Affordable Workforce Housing** properties, Cole Mill Place and Holloway Place, offer a total of 16 affordable housing units.
